I hope you had a wonderful St. Patrick's weekend. I was able to visit Dundrum Methodist on Sunday and see my friend who was preaching. Dundrum, in their contemporary service now do a café style church. I personally loved it. Maybe it is in Centenary's future, who knows! My day got worse though, as Liverpool (my football club) lost in the dying embers against our fierce rivals Manchester United. It was a cruel blow I must admit, we got so far and fell just short. It seemed to be a bit of a theme for me last weekend. On Friday, I visited Rathgar Primary school to do an assembly. A very easy task some might think...WELL!

I decided to do the orange illustration I used at church a few weeks ago if you can remember, where you peel one orange – it sinks and the second orange, unpeeled – stays afloat. That was the plan! Lo and behold, when I did it, the orange that was meant to sink started floating. You could imagine my shock and dismay on my face as my little trick not working the way it was meant to, and then having to turn around to primary school children and explain it to them! I'm pretty sure the line I used was "that wasn't meant to happen".

I wonder have you ever had a "that wasn't meant to happen" moment? Maybe you expected to get different results for work you had put in or maybe you expected God to do something, and it didn't come to pass. I have these moments on a daily basis if you need any encouragement!!
