# **Thought for the Week**

I am in Cork for a few days, catching up with family and looking after trees that have been planted over the last few years. It is a joy to see them bursting into leaf. The damp spring that has been such a trial to farmers is good for trees. Farmers are mightily relieved to see high pressure moving in over Ireland, with minimal rain expected over the next 10 days.

I was at the Gurteen Agricultural College last Tuesday. The principal Jon Parry shared a conversation between students. The consensus was that climate change is not just a future problem that needs to be prepared for. It is a present problem that needs to be managed.

Sensing desperation, Donard Methodist in Newcastle, Co. Down has organised a Farmer's Well being Service on Saturday from 10-3pm. The day will include a video from Gurteen, a talk from Rev K. Hanna, rural chaplain in the Presbyterian Church, and a health check team.

I remember a story about a priest who when asked to pray for rain replied that there was no point until the wind changed to the south-west! I would argue that there is a place for prayer regarding the weather, but I wouldn't make a habit of it. We read these words in the epistle of James. *Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains. You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near.*

#### Earth Day – 22<sup>nd</sup> April

Earth Day has been marked since 1970 when 20 million Americans first mobilised to call for greater protection for the planet. Events are now held in 192 countries worldwide, with the aim of holding sectors accountable for their role in the environmental crisis and calling for bold, creative, and innovative solutions.

The theme for Earth Day 2024 is Planet vs. Plastics, demanding a 60% reduction in the production of plastics by 2040 and an ultimate goal of building a plastic-free future for generations to come.



To achieve a 60% reduction by 2040, EARTHDAY.ORG's goals are:

- Promoting widespread public awareness of the damage done by plastic to human, animal, and all biodiversity's health and demanding more research be conducted on its health implications;
- Rapidly phasing out all single use plastics by 2030 and achieving this phase out commitment in the United Nations Treaty on Plastic Pollution due in 2024;
- Demanding policies ending the scourge of fast fashion and the vast amount of plastic it produces and uses;
- Investing in innovative technologies and materials to build a plastic-free world.
