Thought for the Week

We are drawing close to the end of Lent, which means I am one day closer to having my beloved coffee again! But more importantly we are about to enter Holy Week. One of my colleagues in Trinity – Fr. Peter Sexton, regularly gives updates to the students who frequent the chaplaincy about what is going on. And yesterday was no different. As he shared, he mentioned about the importance of Holy Week to the life of a Christian. It got me thinking about how I think we can sometimes just go through the motions as Christians, and just go from one Sunday to another, one part of the church calendar to another. It is far too easy for us to be nonchalant about significant times in our calendar.

I think Lent sort of confronts us on this, because it is a time where waiting is the predominant word or action we are forced to take...and Holy Week really ramps it up. Holy week is one of my favourite times of the year. In Tallaght Methodist for example, they run a Cedar meal with Andrew expertly leading us through the last supper. On Thursday, I usually find myself in my old church, Kilternan, where they do the stripping of the table. I never thought I would be one who gets incredibly moved at the sight of a bare table...but yet I am. Everyone leaving the church in silence adds a sombreness that I really value.

On Good Friday I have usually taken part in a Good Friday walk with the churches from our local area in Centenary, with readings at each church. This year will be a bit different for me as the chaplaincy in Trinity holds an ecumenical service on Good Friday and I need to be in attendance! So if you are not doing anything at midday on Good Friday, do come along to our chapel in Trinity. You'll get to see me be all formal and whatnot!

Might I encourage you as we enter Holy Week that you take a moment in your day to stop and pause as we reflect on the most important week for Christians.

'Reconciliation' is the theme for the 100th anniversary of the extension to the church in Rathgar.



Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.82, and pro rata for donations of over €250. This scheme brought in over €17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.


