Thought for the week

'I lie down and sleep in peace, for you alone, O LORD, make me dwell in safety' Psalm 4:8.

The last couple of weeks have been an exceptionally busy. 11 Arranmore Road is up for sale, and thankfully there have been many viewings and great interest. Bidding is now hotting up. There is power in a name. The property was built by Cramptons, a Methodist firm renowned for integrity and craftsmanship. The Bible says, 'A good name is better than great riches, to be esteemed is better than silver or gold' Proverbs 22:1. Of course the Circuit requires a replacement Manse, and we are busy about that. There has been a funeral, several Church Councils, other meetings, an RTE Broadcast rehearsal, and a Circuit Celebration. I came home from Church on Sunday happy, but utterly exhausted. I'm sure that we can all relate to having had those feelings. Yet a good night's sleep does wonders.

Psalm 4 is worth a read. David covers a whole gamut of emotions. Indeed his prayer begins with him in considerable distress. 
Prayer

Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.82, and pro rata for donations of over €250. This scheme brought in over €17,000 last year. To register, you need

an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
