The recording of the service in the RTE studios last Sunday afternoon, (to be broadcast on RTE 1 television this Sunday at 11am), was a stressful experience for me. I found the whole afternoon difficult. There were long intervals of inactivity for many of us while RTE people were busily doing makeup for those with solo parts, and then recording those solo parts and choral pieces while most of us simply waited. With each element of the service being recorded separately the whole experience was a very long way from a positive worship experience for me. However, upon reflection, we were in a professional recording environment where others were in control, and had their job to do. I have been assured that the service to be transmitted will be seamless and professional with all the separate elements of worship well spliced together. I need to accept that the RTE professionals know what they are doing.

On the positive side, I am incredibly grateful to all who were involved. Though I had chosen the theme 'Lost and Found' in January when approached by Dr Julian Hamilton, I didn't want to get down to serious planning before Easter and the subsequent holidays. My colleague Rev Yongnam Park was very generous in allowing me to ask the Korean Praise Group and Male Voice Choir to participate even though it would take them away from their service. They immediately responded positively. Without any hesitation, Gillie, Moba, Lesley and Geoffrey agreed to lead prayers. Jean happened to be off work for both the rehearsal and the recording days, and kindly agreed to write a reflective introduction to the gospel reading. Again, without any hesitation, Erick and Charles also agreed to read God's word. Others willingly came to augment the congregation and lift the singing. On hearing Hyelee sing Amazing Grace at the Circuit Celebration, I asked if she might be willing to sing the first verse as part of our service. She said yes. I felt that the lovely kid's song, 'I'm Special' would illustrate the readings, and despite his youth, Emmanuel agreed to sing that piece which he had never heard before. None of this would have been possible without the work of our pianist Boon Beng who trained Emmanuel, and who led our worship. You blessed me more than you will ever know. Likewise God is pleased with our service, be it in 'word or deed', when we 'do it in the Name of our Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him'.

Azadi Community Sponsorship Group - A message from Lynne Pasley

As many of you know, I am a member of a community sponsorship group working with the support of the Irish Refugee Council to help an Afghan family settle in Dublin and integrate into Irish society. The family of a father, mother, 20 year old daughter and 17 year old son arrived in October as part of a government scheme to offer refugee status to Afghan people and they are settling into their home in west Dublin. Another daughter and grandson have been living in Dublin for some time and have been assisting the family. The parents attend our Connect Through English group every Thursday. Whilst the state supports are now nearly all in place, we had to look after the family entirely from our own fundraised money for several months with monthly rent of €2400, health expenses and daily living costs and our funds are now depleted. Our group has committed to assisting the family for two years and we need to keep fundraising to assist with additional and unforeseen expenses.

I am taking part in the VHI women's mini marathon on Sunday 1st June to raise funds for our group - Azadi Community Sponsorship Group (Azadi means freedom in Dari, the language spoken by the family) - and I am hoping that you might consider sponsoring me please. Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.82, and pro rata for donations of over €250. This scheme brought in over €17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
