Thought for the week



It might have struck you how similar the services of baptism are for adults, and for children. It reminds us of times in scripture when whole households were baptised together. Biblical scholars suggest that the use of the word households actually suggests the presence of children. However there is something very meaningful when a profession of faith is made public in an adult baptism. In the first part of the service on Sunday Nadia gave a moving testimony of the grace of God in her life, and the second part of the service took place in the 'not so cold' waters of the Irish Sea at Killiney Beach. It was a time of real emotion and great joy with the congregation singing, 'I have decided to follow Jesus', and the Aaronic Blessing. The congregation also promised to,

'So maintain the Church's life of worship and service that she and all who have been baptised may grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of God and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord'.

I thank God that this is something the Centenary congregation takes very seriously. We have been blessed by a number of infant baptisms in recent years. People have stepped up in making church meaningful for these children. In Story Time they teach age appropriate Bible lessons illustrating them by crafts and role play giving children the confidence to participate by reading and praying out loud. We will hear a snapshot of what they do on Sunday.

Those children are now getting older. In September, Story Time will be divided. Those who are toilet trained and able to leave their parents will meet in Room 1 for Sunday Club. Parents with younger children can avail of the low tables in the Coffee Dock where excellent Bible worksheets, books and colouring pencils will be available, not just through the Summer, but throughout the year. Both audio and visual are now relayed to this area. We will have our Blessing of the bags service on Sunday 31st August and Sunday Club will commence on the first Sunday in September.

The following notice is handed to parents in another church, and the words are helpful.

Of course there is no pressure to leave. To the parents/guardians of our youngsters, may we suggest...

- Relax! God put a wiggle in children. Don't feel you have to repress it in God's house.
- Sit towards the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear.
- Quietly explain what we are doing in worship.
- Sing the hymns, pray loud and clearly. Children learn by copying you.
- If you must leave the Service with your child, know that you are all welcome to return.

• Remember the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God, and to one another. Let them know they are at home in this church.

To the members of our church... The presence of children is a gift! They are members of our community and a reminder that our church is growing. Please welcome them and give a smile of encouragement to their parents/guardians.

Finally would you consider being on the rota for Sunday Club? You will never be on your own, and Safeguarding Training and Garda checks will be arranged and keep us all safe. Speak to Andrew, Brian, Rachel, Lyndsey, Mel, Hilary, Caitlin or Lesley to learn more about what is involved.

NATIONAL PLOUGHING CHAMPIONSHIPS 2025: Tues 16th – Thurs 18th September

Dear Friends,

It's that time of the year when we are glad to focus the attention of all the churches in the Southern District to our major outreach opportunity – the Methodist Church stands at the National Ploughing Championships. This year it returns to a location used last decade: Screggan, Tullamore, Co. Offaly. It will be held from Tuesday 16th – Thursday 18th September.



The Methodist Church in Ireland, through Home Missions, believes in the importance of this presence, and is financing the lion's share. We, as Southern District Methodists, have shown our commitment to this over the years. We expect this September to make and hand out 5000 cups of tea/coffee with biscuits, have hundreds of meaningful conversations, hand out hundreds of leaflets of information, respond to 100 or more prayer requests, sing Happy Birthday to a couple dozen people, provide a relaxing space where ten people at a time can sit down, rest, and interact with all that we provide and bring surprise gifts to bless NPA staff.

The main thing we need is the participation of members from across all the churches in the District to make this initiative the success that we believe it will be. Approximately quarter of a million people descend on the site over the three days. We have booked our stand to be on a busy corner beside a main tent entrance. We will need plenty of volunteers who can operate on a rota that includes various types of help and so suit different volunteers.

We need people to volunteer to help so that we cover three main areas:

- To make and serve tea/coffee
- To speak with people, taking an interest in them, answering questions about why we are doing this
- Practical, such as getting water or helping with other needs for the stand or members of the public

We need people who would commit to any of the days for two or more of these main time slots: 9.00-11.00am, 11.00am-1.00pm, 1.00-3.00pm, 3.00-5.00pm And two shorter slots as we set up (7.30am-9.00am) and tidy up (5.00-6.00pm)

We are asking each Circuit to contribute between €50 - €100 to pay for the cost of tickets etc. Your circuit can contribute by cheque or electronic transfer. Cheques should be made out to ANDREW DOUGHERTY and the following bank details are for electronic transfer: IBAN IE21AIBK93312049225185

Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme
