Dear Member,

I had just started writing my thought for the week, when an email came through from Andrew telling me that this would be the last one for the summer. Which means it will also be my last communication while on staff here in Centenary!

It's hard to put words on a page to sum up my time here in Centenary. There have been so many kingdom wins in my time here. We have seen a lot of growth and I am so proud of what we have achieved in such a short space of time. I couldn't pin down one thing that I am most proud of, whether it be leading bible study, reviewing our values, taking services, leading Sunday school or supporting initiatives that were taking place. It has been a privilege to journey with you all through that.

Okay...maybe my favourite moment is something I could share. It was during the service I last led where the reading was Matthew 1 – the genealogy of Christ, and there were names in there that I couldn't pronounce, and the congregation stepped in and said them for me! That just sums up not just Centenary, but the church as a whole, helping, supporting and being vocal when needed.

I suppose to leave you all, I would like to offer some encouragement as we go our separate ways. ## **Call for Sunday school leaders**

I hope you have all been enjoying our series on the Nicene Creed. We have been recording the services, and I am the one who is doing the editing at the moment, and those it can be time consuming, I do get the chance to hear the sermon back about 30 times before I am happy with how it sounds. The first two are available on our website as was mentioned last week. I also really value the chance to get to listen in, because for the past few months I have had the privilege of serving on the Sunday school team. Unfortunately that means I have been missing the majority of messages as we continue our worship in room 1 – a space full of curiosity, laughter, and growing faith. While it's a very different kind of Sunday experience, it's also been a real gift to witness the questions children ask, the wonder in their eyes as they hear the stories of our faith, and the trust they're beginning to place in God.

Sunday School is more than just childcare during the service — it's a space where our youngest members are being formed, where faith is taking root in creative and joyful ways. And it's only possible because of a brilliant team of volunteers who show up, week after week, to welcome, guide, and walk alongside our children. I hope you saw this in action as myself and Lyndsey gave a review of the year in our service.

That said, we'd love to grow our team. The reality is that with a few more volunteers, we can make Sunday School more sustainable for everyone involved. Right now, some leaders are stepping in quite often – and they do it gladly – but we'd love to share the responsibility more evenly across a wider group. If we had just a few additional helpers, it would mean each person would only need to serve about three times per semester. That's not every week, or even every month – just three opportunities across a whole term to support this ministry and bless our young people.

You don't need to be a teacher or have all the answers — just a willingness to be present, a heart to serve, and a sense of humour definitely helps too! We provide all the materials and guidance you need, and there's always someone else on the team with you.

So if you've been wondering about how to get involved or if you're looking for a meaningful way to serve in the church, we'd love to hear from you. You'll be making a real difference, not just in giving the current team some breathing room, but in helping nurture the next generation in faith.

# National Ploughing Championships 2025: Tues 16th – Thurs 18th September Dear Friends,

It's that time of the year when we are glad to focus the attention of all the churches in the Southern District to our major outreach opportunity – the Methodist Church stand at the National Ploughing Championships. This year it returns to a location used last decade: Screggan, Tullamore, Co. Offaly. It will be held from Tuesday 16th – Thursday 18th September.



The Methodist Church in Ireland, through Home Missions, believes in the importance of this presence, and is financing the lion's share. We, as Southern District Methodists, have shown our commitment to this over the years. We expect this September to make and hand out 5000 cups of tea/coffee with biscuits, have hundreds of meaningful conversations, hand out hundreds of information leaflets, respond to 100 or more prayer requests, sing Happy Birthday to a couple of dozen people, provide a relaxing space where ten people at a time can sit down, rest, and interact with all that we provide and bring surprise gifts to bless National Ploughing Championship staff and volunteers.

The main thing we need is the participation of members from across all the churches in the District to make this initiative the success that we believe it will be. Approximately quarter of a million people descend on the site over the three days. We have booked our stand to be on a busy corner beside a main tent entrance. We will need plenty of volunteers who can operate on a rota that includes various types of help and so suit different volunteers.

We need people to volunteer to help so that we cover three main areas:

To make and serve tea/coffee

To speak with people, taking an interest in them, answering questions about why we are doing this Practical, such as getting water or helping with other needs for the stand or members of the public

We need people who would commit to any of the days for two or more of these main time slots: 9.00-11.00am, 11.00am-1.00pm, 1.00-3.00pm, 3.00-5.00pm

And two shorter slots as we set up (7.30am-9.00am) and tidy up (5.00-6.00pm)

We are asking each Circuit to contribute between €50 - €100 to pay for the cost of tickets etc. Your circuit can contribute by cheque or electronic transfer. Cheques should be made out to Andrew Dougherty and the following bank details are for electronic transfer: IBAN IE21AIBK93312049225185

#### **Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme**

A taxpayer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.82, and pro rata for donations of over €250. This scheme brought in over €17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
