## Thought for the week

Abundance and a sense of urgency. This Season of Creation is bringing me both. The harvest of fruit and vegetables is particularly rich. Everyone with an apple tree says "take as many as your like", a friend passing on a bicycle hands me a bag of fresh figs, the potato crop is plentiful so I am being offered samples of kerrs pinks, maris pipers and roosters, with golden wonders yet to come. The kale and spinach in my brother's garden seems to increase and multiply the more it is picked. Even at Sky's the Limit we got delicious tomatoes from the Parkins' garden! The tomatoes were easy to enjoy immediately, but making jam and filling the freezer with apple pies, kale soup and spinach frittata requires work. The sense of urgency is taking over.



What does Season of Creation offer to make the tasks more uplifting? The theme for this year is Peace with Creation and is inspired by Isaiah 32:14-18. "Until a spirit from on high is poured out on us, and the wilderness becomes a fruitful field, and the fruitful field is deemed a forest. Then justice will dwell in the wilderness and righteousness abide in the fruitful field." Letting the fruitful fields return to wilderness, with bountiful crops rotting on the soil while we buy plastic-wrapped imported alternatives does not seem an option.

There is a multiplicity of tasks in creation care and they are interconnected. David Greenlee speaks of "a lived-out value that can add beautiful flavour to how we live and what we do, both in demonstration and explanation of the gospel".\*

We will reflect more on this "multiplicity of tasks" at our Season of Creation Service in Centenary on Sunday 28th September.

#### Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes  $\in$ 250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover  $\in$ 112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to  $\in$ 362.82, and pro rata for donations of over  $\in$ 250. This scheme brought in over  $\in$ 17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
