Thought for the week



Action for the environment is keeping us busy at Centenary these days. It is a joy that projects are finally being concluded more than a year since we were first approved for funding from the Dublin City Council (DCC) Community Climate Fund. The new bicycle cage was 'tested' by student Peter Lewis on Friday morning and pronounced 'fine'. If you are curious, the cost was €13,721, funded by DCC. The Leinster House version cost €336,000. Energy saving doors have been installed with grant funding totalling €37,198. Pollinator friendly planting is to be added during October.

This is about much more than a 'windfall' for building upgrades that we might not otherwise afford. Participation in the DCC programme makes us part of a network of communities supporting Ireland's commitment to reducing its carbon emissions by 51% by 2030 and becoming a climate neutral economy by 2050. These are ambitious targets and need much more than small efforts like ours. There are grounds to be

sceptical, but if Christian churches give in to despair and inaction on climate and related social justice, how can they retain credibility in wider society?

Pope Leo, at the recent conference to mark ten years of Laudato Si, highlighted the importance of beginning this work from a basis of faith:

"These challenges are of a social and political nature, but first and foremost of a spiritual nature: they call for conversion. May each of us grow in these four relationships — with God, with others, with nature and with ourselves — through a constant attitude of conversion. Integral ecology thrives on all these relationships. Through our commitment to them, we can grow in hope"

Bible Study - The Romans Course next session 15th October





Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.82, and pro rata for donations of over €250. This scheme brought in over €17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
