Thought for the week

The Romans Course is full of helpful illustrations. This one by Dr Andrew Ollerton amused me. 'When I was growing up, one of my favourite comedians was Peter Kay. As a northerner, he was well trained at dunking a biscuit in a mug of tea. On one of his shows, he captured the devastating moment when a weak biscuit like a Rich Tea is overwhelmed by the heat and collapses into your mug. By contract, he suggests, Hobnob biscuits are made of sturdier stuff. They are so resilient they can take a good dunking and still come back for more! So, it is with faith: if we are to become resilient Christians, the key is not in being brave types who win medals. What makes the difference is that we are secure in God's unchanging love. Then, instead of giving way in the heat, we can live out the truth that suffering produces perseverance.'

Faith is like a muscle that will weaken if not used. Suffering can lead to growth and character development. Paul turns the idea of suffering as a sign of weakness and defeat on its head when he says that we 'glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.' (Romans 5:2-5)

No two weeks are the same.


People come to Ireland for all sorts of reasons – e.g. education, work, in search of asylum or sometimes with Refugee status which has already been granted.



Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.82, and pro rata for donations of over €250. This scheme brought in over €17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
