# Thought for the week

On Bank Holiday Monday I took the opportunity to walk up Kippure which at 2,434 feet is the 'top' of County Dublin and the 56<sup>th</sup> highest mountain in Ireland. Though the summit was in the clouds there was no chance of getting lost as a tarred road serves the RTE mast that makes Kippure so recognisable. I found it quite steep but was humbled by a cyclist who cycled past. Respect!

Romans Chapter 8 is a high point in the Bible. Andrew Ollerton puts it well. From this vantage point Paul looks back to our past (justification) and declares no condemnation. He considers how secure we are in the present as God's children (adoption), before finally looking ahead to a future hope of resurrection and new creation (glorification).



In the photograph, the elevation allowed for a longer view across to Greater Sugarloaf, Little Sugarloaf, peaks hidden from the lower slopes. Ollerton continues, 'This section of Romans 8 therefore gives a glimpse of our ultimate hope. When times are tough and suffering hits, knowing that a glorious future lies ahead can keep us going. We all engage in mental equations to determine whether present effort and cost is worthwhile. *Shall I keep going to the gym, be part of a church, complete a training course, stay faithful to my spouse?* Too often short sighted thinking means we quit early and regret it later.'

#### **Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme**
