### Thought for the week



RTE Nationwide had a very lovely programme about Dublin Airport on Monday. A longstanding member of staff was asked to share her favourite moments. Without hesitation she replied that it is the homecoming of our peacekeepers as they are reunited with families. I am even emotional now as I view the picture of Comdt. Paul Conlon, from Roscommon who returned from a six month tour in Syria, being reunited with his children, Senan, Oisin and Saoirse; mother, Janice and wife Brenda. On Sunday we will remember many who never came home along with some of those who did. Those who died on the battlefields of the two world wars numbered about one in twenty of those who served. Yet many who did come home were broken and scarred. Others never spoke of the horrors they experienced. The Second World War saw a much greater number of civilian casualties. Sadly, having come through some decades of respect for international borders, that has now broken down ushering us into a period of bloody conflict in many countries and of a heightened anxiety for many others. We are pivoting away from seeing war through an historical lens.

Thank you to those who have already sent me photos of those that you will be remembering in a special way on Sunday. These will be displayed on PowerPoint. I would be grateful if others could email or WhatsApp me with other photos accompanied by names and rank, and other information so that we can remember them well, including those who came home. Remembering is important if we are not to repeat the mistakes of the past.

There are three significant events related to Remembrance that might be of interest (see above). All wars end, and the Second World War ended eighty years ago. It is no accident that the end of that war coincides with the founding of Christian Aid. The world was flooded with destitute refugees, and Churches united to bring aid, healing and wholeness. Now that is also worth remembering.

#### Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes  $\in$ 250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover  $\in$ 112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to  $\in$ 362.82, and pro rata for donations of over  $\in$ 250. This scheme brought in over  $\in$ 17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
